Paper submission guidelines

Paper should be submitted electronically to geg@uj.edu.pl. Submitted papers will be peer reviewed.

Format

Paper should be 10 pages long, including tables, figures, notes, references. All papers should include an abstract of 150 words and keywords at the end of the abstract. Manuscript should be submitted in Open Office, MS Word or .pdf. Use Time New Roman, 12-point font with 1.5-spaced.

The main headings should be in all caps and be aligned left while subheadings should have only the first word capitalized and should be also aligned left. Both should be in bold type.

Use footnotes (instead of endnotes) and use Arabic numerals for footnotes (1,2,3...). Please do not overuse footnotes.

Use in-text citation, following the author-date method.

All foreign words should be written in italic type.

Every citation included in the text must be indexed in the Reference list at the end of the paper and every book/article mentioned in the Reference list must be cited in the text (otherwise they cannot be included in the Reference list).

Short quotation should be included in the text and marked by quotation mark.

According to Smith (1996: 45), “The gender equality policy is transposed from the European Union”. She stated that “The gender equality policy is transposed from the European Union” (Smith 1996: 45).

Quotation longer than 40 words should be placed in a free-standing block without quotation mark. The quotation should be written in a new line, intended 2 cm from the left margin. Maintain Time New Roman, 12-point font with 1.5-spaced.

Citation in the text

Please use Chicago Manual Style: <http://www.chicagomanualofstyle.org/home.html>

In the case of numerous citation, alphabetize the reference by author's name (Goffman 1967; Lister 2007; Werbner 2014). Please use semi-comma to separate the references. Please do not use semi-comma nor commas to separate the name and the date (Lister 2007).

In case of multiple authors, use up to three authors' names. If there are more than three authors, please use the name of the first author followed by et al. (Miller et al. 2000).

In case of citing many articles or books written by an author in the same year, please use a, b, c with date (Lister 1997a; Lister 1997b).

If an article or a book is in press, use "forthcoming" instead of date (Butler forthcoming).

Note: please use the full authors' first name (not abbreviated form). Title should be italicized.

Chapter or article in edited book

Note: no page number needed. Please do not use quotation mark for the title of an article or chapter.

Journal article

Note: please separate each author by comma and add "and" before the last name. The second and following names should start with the name followed by surname. Please do not use commas between name and surname of second and following authors.

If there is only one author, please start with the surname and then add name. Please separate the surname and name by comma.

Separate the article title and the journal title by full stop. Please do not use quotation mark for article title. The journal title should be italicised.

Page numbers should be included.

If there is no volume – please include information about the number – e.g. *title of journal* 2: 56-78.

If there is no volume and it is weekly – please add year after the name of authors and a date and pages after the journal title – e.g. 25 June, 77-90.
